1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to prohibit the State of South Dakota and its political
2 subdivisions from adopting and developing United Nations sponsored environmental and
3 developmental policies that would infringe or restrict the private property rights of the
4 owners of private property.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

6 Section 1. Neither the State of South Dakota nor any of its political subdivisions may adopt
7 or implement policy recommendations that deliberately or inadvertently infringe or restrict
8 private property rights without due process, as may be required by policy recommendations
9 originating in, or traceable to Agenda 21, adopted by the United Nations in 1992 at its
10 Conference on Environment and Development or any other international law or ancillary plan
11 of action that contravenes the Constitution of the United States or the Constitution of the State
12 of South Dakota.

13 Section 2. Neither the State of South Dakota nor any of its political subdivisions may enter
14 into any agreement, expend any sum of money, or receive funds contracting services, or giving
15 financial aid to or from those nongovernmental and inter-governmental organizations as set
16 forth in Agenda 21.

Please include language to stop the financing of "sustainable development" courses in our states schools and colleges! Passage of this law will fulfill the Republican Platform item on page 2.

Eight states introduced Stop Agenda 21 bills this year: Alabama, Arizona, Georgia, Kansas, Louisiana, Minnesota, New Hampshire, and Tennessee.

Here is Alabama's new law, a binding, anti-Agenda 21 bill that was passed into law by the Alabama state legislature in May, 2012 and signed by the Governor:

SB477

4 ENROLLED, An Act,

5 Relating to due process; to prohibit the State of
6 Alabama and its political subdivisions from adopting and
7 developing environmental and developmental policies that,

8 without due process, would infringe or restrict the private
9 property rights of the owner of the property.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, "political
12 subdivisions" means all state, county, incorporated city,
13 unincorporated city, public local entity, public-private
14 partnership, and any other public entity of the state, a
15 county, or city.

16 (b) The State of Alabama and all political
17 subdivisions may not adopt or implement policy recommendations
18 that deliberately or inadvertently infringe or restrict
19 private property rights without due process, as may be
20 required by policy recommendations originating in, or
21 traceable to "Agenda 21," adopted by the United Nations in
22 1992 at its Conference on Environment and Development or any
23 other international law or ancillary plan of action that
24 contravenes the Constitution of the United States or the
25 Constitution of the State of Alabama.

1 (c) Since the United Nations has accredited and
2 enlisted numerous non-governmental and inter-governmental
3 organizations to assist in the implementation of its policies
4 relative to Agenda 21 around the world, the State of Alabama
5 and all political subdivisions may not enter into any
6 agreement, expend any sum of money, or receive funds
7 contracting services, or giving financial aid to or from those
8 non-governmental and inter-governmental organizations as
9 defined in Agenda 21.

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
11 first day of the third month following its passage and
12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

THE FOLLOWING IS PART OF THE SOUTH DAKOTA REPUBLICAN PLATFORM—JUNE 2012:

**Resolution 8
Exposing United Nations Agenda 21**

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Republican Party recognizes that we are called to be good stewards of the land and its resources, and

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Republican Party views United Nations Agenda 21 as a comprehensive plan of extreme environmentalism, social engineering and global political control, that was initiated at the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, in 1992; and

WHEREAS, United Nations Agenda 21 is being covertly pushed into local communities throughout South Dakota and the United States of America through the International Council of Local Environmental Initiatives

(ICLEI) through local “sustainable development” policies such as Smart Growth, Wildlands Project, Resilient Cities, Regional Visioning Projects, and other “Green” or “Alternative” projects; and

WHEREAS, United Nations Agenda 21 plan of “sustainable development” views private property ownership, single family homes, private vehicle ownership; individual travel choices, and privately owned farms as destructive to the environment; and

WHEREAS, according to United Nations Agenda 21, social justice is described as the right and opportunity of all people to benefit equally from the resources afforded us by society and the environment which United Nations Agenda 21 would accomplish by socialist/communist redistribution of wealth; and

WHEREAS, according to United Nations Agenda 21 national sovereignty is deemed a social injustice; now therefore be it RESOLVED, that the South Dakota Republican Party recognizes the destructive and insidious nature of United Nations Agenda 21 and hereby exposes the dangerous intent of United Nations Agenda 21; and

therefore be it further RESOLVED, that the South Dakota Republican Party views United Nations Agenda 21 as an infringement on the inalienable rights of citizens of the United States.

RESOLVED that South Dakota, its local governments, and school districts be well informed of the harmful implications of implementation of United Nations Agenda 21 and we hereby reject its destructive strategies for sustainable development.
